- Five pairs (ten items) bronze Art Deco bookends in the shape of a dancer with draped cloth. Made late 1920s to early 1930s by Armor Bronze Company, USA.
 - Art Deco bronze rocker ink blotter with a Greek Key pattern.
 - Pair of bronze bookends in the shape of full figured horses standing by a fence.
 - Pair of nickel plated, cast iron bookends in the shape of full figured elephants.
 - Art Deco Frankart bronze desk tray with cast bronze figure of a panther, after Carvin.
 - Pair of bronze bookends in the shape of standing deer by Frankart New York. 1922-1932.
 - Pair of Art Deco bronze bookends in the shapes of elephants mounted on mirrored, nickel plated steel, with original blue felt pads, after Carvin.
 - Pair of cast iron, copper plated Art Deco cathedral bookends.
 - Pair of bronze, brass, and copper bookends depicting full figure male wrestlers, with articulated metal bases.
 - Pair of Frankart bookends in the shape of Siamese cats, brass over spelter cast, 1922-1932.
 - Pair of bookends with a nickel plated, cast iron dancing girls mounted on a two tier wooden plinths.
 - Pair of rare Frankart bookends with red painted cockatoos on black cast iron bases.
