	AM: This kimono represents the cultural appropriation (ie: Japonisme) in fashion that was popular in the 1920s. Though it is an authentic kimono, the colours and print are very representative of Western style. It is a great blend of East and West.

Made in England AM: Examples of fashions that are for personal use are a great way to get in the mind of its wearer. This bathing costume would not have been seen by many people, yet the detail is beautiful. Black crepe velvet dress with velvet 9 cuffs, collar and U-shaped hip detail and zipper closure at center back, 1930's AM: the 1930s represents an interesting time in fashion, due to the Depression, and WWII on the horizon. Velvet is a fabric that cannot be cut creatively to conserve fabric, because of the nap. A velvet dress represents extravagant excess in a time of economic and political upheaval.

AM: This is a quintessential dress of the late 1930's.
