## LUMINATO HIGHLIGHTS THE ART OF LITERARY TRANSLATION WITH NEW 2010 FESTIVAL EVENT

**TORONTO, May 18, 2010 – Luminato, Toronto Festival of Arts and Creativity**, announces the addition of the **Blue Metropolis Translation Slam** to its 2010 line-up, featuring 2009 Griffin Poetry prize-winner **A. F. Moritz** and translations of his work into Mandarin by **Ma Ainong** and **Lien Chao**, The **Blue Metropolis Translation Slam** premieres at Luminato before moving to Expo 2010 in Shanghai as the only literary event being staged at the Canada Pavilion. The **Blue Metropolis Translation Slam** event is free to the public and takes place **June 19, 2010, 6 p.m.** at the Isabel Bader Theatre.

The **Blue Metropolis Translation Slam** begins with the reading of an original piece of work in English by the Toronto-based Moritz, followed by a reading of two separate and independentlycreated interpretations of this piece by Mandarin translators **Ma Ainong** and **Lien Chao**. Bilingual host **Yan Liang** helps guide the audience through these readings in an effort to highlight the fascinating natural differences that occur when a piece of work is translated from one language to another. The **Blue Metropolis Translation Slam** provides Festival-goers with an opportunity to explore the level of artistry that goes into translating and interpreting literary works.

The **Blue Metropolis Translation Slam** is the signature event of Montreal's Blue Metropolis Foundation and has been a popular mainstay at the Blue Metropolis Montreal International Literary Festival since the festival's inception in 1999. This version of the **Blue Metropolis Translation Slam** moves to the Canada Pavilion at the World Expo 2010 as well as the Shanghai Writers' Association on September 13 and 14. The Canada Pavilion's cultural program is produced by Cirque du Soleil on behalf of the Government of Canada.
